

Good morning everyone,

I hope you have all had a good week and the children have enjoyed wearing their odd socks in school to celebrate our individual differences. After a frantic week last week with Children in Need, this week we have been enjoying listening to the practice of the Year 3 children building up to today's year group assembly. I have particularly enjoyed the time I have spent in Early Years and Key Stage I classrooms this week listening to the children and staff working on their Little Wandle phonics and reading practice session. Of course we have the beginnings of the odd creative Christmas activity going on in school (I know the kiln is constant use firing ceramics!) and even the recorders are starting to sound a touch more musical!

School development priorities

Under more normal circumstances, I would have updated you on school development priorities before this stage of the autumn term. It is important that school shares its priorities with you so that you know the direction in which the school is progressing.

As you may know, the school's under performance in last year's Key Stage 2 assessment was disappointing, particularly in regard to writing attainment which fell well below the high standards we set ourselves. I want to reassure you that this is not an endemic picture within our school. Our Key Stage I writing assessment for 2022 was in fact, in excess of the national average for writing last year. Our in year data does not reflect the KS2 attainment last year.

However, what is most important now, is that the staff, the governing body and I, reassure you all that school will respond appropriately at both a strategic and operational level to ensure the writing provision, assessment, moderation process and ultimately, both attainment and progress, allows our current children to attain the results I know they will work so hard for. The school's 3 main improvement targets for 2023-24 are therefore:

I. Improving writing

 Developing children's independence in emotional response and self-regulation across the school
Whole school church effectiveness
