

## Year One Autumn Newsletter 2024

Dear Parents,

Welcome to Year 1. It has been lovely getting to know your children over the last week and we hope they are enjoying their new classrooms. We are currently planning our introductory meeting for parents which will be held in school on Monday 16<sup>th</sup> September at 5:30pm. In this meeting, we will go through the teaching approaches, curriculum and routines of Year 1 - it will be lovely if you can make it.

This year, we are continuing to teach phonics through Little Wandle: Letters and Sounds Revised. We started our whole class lessons this week and the children are engaging really well and showing us what they learnt in Reception. From next Friday, the children will bring home a reading book which they have learnt to read in school. These books will then be changed the following Friday. Any reading is welcomed and will count towards their 25 reads for reading champions this half term. As in Reception, the children are encouraged to read as much as they can from a range of books, either their school ones, ones they have at home or online. It doesn't need to be a full book, just a few pages each day will allow your child to be a reading champion as we count the comments, not the number of books. Please therefore, ensure you comment in your child's reading diary each time they read at home as we do read and value your comments.

We are very lucky to have outdoor learning in Year 1 this term. Forest School takes place on a Tuesday Afternoon.

PE this half term is invasion games and we will be focusing on ball skills. Our PE session with Mr Jacobs is on a Monday, and on Fridays we have Dance. Please can the children come dressed for PE on Monday's and Fridays and ready for Forest School on Tuesdays.

It is thirsty work in Year 1 so please make sure your child has a water bottle in school every day — thank you to those who are already doing this.

Our first topic this half term is themed around the book 'Here We Are' by Oliver Jeffers which the whole school are focussing on. We also include Space within this theme. We will then move on to learning about Our Bodies and Five Senses, Seasides and Toys in the Past.
