Dear Parents,

Our first topic this half term is Toys from the Past. We will start by talking about the children's own toys and then move on to exploring and finding out about toys from long ago. To help with this please support your child with completing the parents and grandparents interview questionnaires over the Christmas period (please see separate email with more information about this).

Our English topic is themed around different Julia Donaldson books and we will be exploring the pattern and rhyme in these. If you have any books by Julia Donaldson at home it would be great if you could share these at home and talk about the rhyming words in the stories. We will have a week of learning about the season of winter towards the end of the half term and then we will be learning about Africa after half term.

We are very lucky to have Forest School again after Christmas on **Tuesdays** so please ensure the children bring appropriate warm kit, including wellies and waterproofs ready for outdoor learning.

Reading champions will begin on 6th January and we will be awarding those who read 30 times or more during this half term.
