Dear Parents and carers,

Welcome to our Foundation Stage Spring term newsletter, where we will discuss the topics and events we have coming up this next term.

<u>Phonics</u>	After working hard learning our phonemes and digraphs, we will introduce many new digraphs (2 letters 1 sound — oa, ee, ie, oo) and trigraphs (3 letters 1 sound — ear, air, igh). We will also continue to work on blending and segmenting words to read and	
	spell. Weekly homework will continue to be sent on a Thursday to support their phonic and maths knowledge.	
Reading	We will continue our group reading sessions in class. We will be doing 2 sessions a week and we will continue to send individual reading books home. Reading Champions will restart each half term with a target of 30 reads for next half term.	
Literacy	We will be applying our phonic knowledge, practising pencil control, handwriting and letter formation, spelling of key words and sentence structure.	
<u>Maths</u>	We will focus on understanding and applying numbers within 10, mass and capacity, length, height, time and exploring 3D shapes.	
Personal,	We will be making New Year resolutions, discussing feelings and	
Social and	emotions, saying sorry, understanding the importance of sleep and

Expressive	We will be creating Chinese New Year crafts, cooking, exploring

Communication	We will have opportunities to use story language, retelling

This term we have lots of exciting things going on and lots to learn! Firstly, we will be enjoying the topics of Chinese New Year and Traditional Tales, and after half term we will learn about New life and On the Farm. In our Religious Education learning, our topic is What we see in our Wonderful World'

Reading Champions

We are continuing to take part in the 'Reading Champions' challenge along with the rest of KS1. This is to promote a love of reading and reward children for the super reading they do at home! We are really proud of the number of Reading Champions we had last term and hope to beat our number this half term! A 'read' could be any form of reading e.g. shopping list, magazine, shop signs, recipes, school reading book, library book or any book from home. We recommend that you read with your child for 5-10 minutes every night. Every time an adult from home e.g. mum, dad, grandma, grandad etc, reads with your child they must sign and date the reading record (12.2.22 Alex read well, he really enjoyed the story. Dad).

This term we are aiming for 30 reads, with a max of 2 reads counted per day.

Our FS and KS1 Reading Champions assembly will be on the last week of the half term.

<u>Class Assembly</u>

Our first Foundation Stage Year Group assembly will be on **Thursday 23rd January at 9.15am**. Grown-ups are welcome to attend our class assembly. Please meet at the main entrance at 9am.

Spring 1 Indoor PE - FRIDAYS

This half term, PE will change to a **Friday**. It will be indoor PE in the hall, learning the fundamentals of ball skills and team games. Please dress your child in PE kit on a Friday from wb 6th January 2025 until wb 10th February 2025.

Spring 2 Outdoor PE with RICK FOX - THURSDAYS

After half term, we will have outdoor PE lessons with Rick Fox. This will be on Thursdays. Please dress your child in outdoor PE kit.

This will consist of a plain white t-shirt and dark black or blue hoodie, plain black or navy jogging bottoms and trainers. Please dress your child in PE kit on a Thursday from wb 24th February 2025 until wb 31st March 2025.

Name reminder

Please ensure **all** items of clothing, bags and water bottles are named, this includes jumpers, cardigans, hats, scarves, gloves, waterproofs and wellies. We always endeavour to return property to its rightful home - thank you! Please check the uniform and belongings you have at home, as we do have some missing items. Thank you.

'Just in case' bag

We send your child's 'just in case' bag home at the end of every term as they may need refreshing, they may have grown out of clothes or they may have been used. Please return it with them on their first day back in January. Please label everything right down to socks and underwear. As the weather worsens, the children must have a spare change of clothes in school in a labelled bag. We recommend a white t-shirt, a jumper/cardigan, socks/tights, a few pairs of underwear, trousers (plain joggers or school trousers) or skirt / dress. We have very few items of spare clothing at school, so these bags are extremely helpful.

Welly Day

Each year group will participate in a Welly Day once a term. Our Welly Day will be on Wednesday 19th March Our whole year group will spend the day together exploring our grounds, making Spring crafts and learning lots about the change in the season. On this day, your child will need to come dressed comfortable, old clothes (no uniform needed) as we plan to get a little muddy. Please also bring waterproof trousers/puddlesuit, a warm, waterproof coat and of course, wellies. We will plan to be outside all day, so please ensure your child will be warm and dry.

Stay and Play

Each term we enjoy inviting our grown-ups into our classrooms to see the exciting things we get up to! There will be lots of activities for you to have a go at and anything you make, you can take home! We ask that a maximum of two adults per child attend as we have a limited amount of space. Class 1's Stay and Play will be on Tuesday 25th March at 2.15pm and Class 2's Stay and Play will be on Wednesday 26th March at 2.15pm. Please arrive at the main entrance slightly before 2.15pm to sign in.
